1. First group of questions:

Before we proceed with the application process, we kindly invite all applicants to answer the following question with a simple YES or NO. This small step will help both you and us assess whether this fellowship would be a meaningful and mutually good fit.

1.1. Do you already have a team of three people assembled for this fellowship?

1.2. Will your team commit to a 1 week immersion in March 2026 and monthly Zoom based sessions until October 2026?

1.3. Can every member of your team communicate effectively in English? Please note that English is the official language of the fellowship.

1.4. Do you have a clear idea for a climate and health-related project or campaign that you plan to further develop this year?

1.5. Is one of your key goals to engage other clinicians as part of your project or campaign?
